



## The OASIS Intergenerational Tutoring Program

Help open a world of literature and share the love of reading with a child. The OASIS Intergenerational Tutoring Program combats the problem of illiteracy with an innovative approach designed to build children's self-esteem and positive attitudes toward learning while strengthening reading skills. Working with elementary schools, OASIS adults work with younger children who are having difficulty learning to read. Volunteers work one-on-one with Kg.-4th grade students each week as tutors, mentors, and friends. The program has proven to be beneficial to both the student and the tutors, and has received high marks from educators.

In the OASIS Tutoring Program, you will receive 8 hours of training and practice with the Literacy Approach. In addition, bi-monthly check-up meetings in which we share ideas and discuss problems and solutions will be conducted. You will need to commit to the one hour per week session with one child for the entire school year. The student courts on you and looks forward to your time spent with them!
