














Mrs. Antol's School Supply List

Dear incoming class,

I hope you have enjoyed a summer filled with rest and relaxation. In order to prepare yourself for the upcoming 5th grade school year, there are skills and supplies that you will need to have ready by the first week of school. First and foremost, basic multiplication facts 0-12 need to be memorized. It is also important that you are in the habit of reading at least 20 minutes a day. I also teach cursive, so if you do not know it at all, you may want to practice your letters at home, so it will not be new to you on the first day of school.

There are a few school supplies that I require all of my students to have in order to be organized and prepared for the upcoming year.

Supply List:

1. 2 Accordion folders, anything 7 pockets or over is fine (this is used in place of a binder) One is a replacement for when the first one breaks.....they always do.
2. 8 composition notebooks (this should get your students through the entire year)
- 3.. mechanical pencils and replacement lead and erasers
4. 1 red pen and 1 blue pen for grading and editing
5. Colored pencils (twistable are preferred)
6. Adult scissors
7. 1 regular sharpie and one thin sharpie
8. Liquid glue or glue sticks
9. 3 sturdy, pocket folders (used for privacy and project work)
10. Clear tape
11. at least 1 foam poster board to have for projects (this keeps parents from having to make a 9pm Target trip to buy one the night before a project is due) This can stay at home until the time of the project.
12. 1 pack of Lined filler paper
13. 1 pack of note cards
14. Colored highlighter
15. White board marker and an eraser (could be a stray sock)
16. Markers (thin and thick)
17. Ruler
18. Crayons (preferred twistables)
19. Pencil box organizer
20. Sticky notes
21. Bookmark
