Review of the past January 21, 2017 ASU kicked off CSI at ASU Skysong Focused efforts identified:

- 1. Student Centered Approaches
- 2. Define CHS Challenges
- 3. Address how CSI could overcome those challenges









CSI: The challenges at CHS included

• 73% four year graduation rate over time (2015-2016)



- 10% AzMERIT Math overall percent passing over time (2015-2016)
- 14% AzMERIT English Language Arts percent passing over time (2015-2016)





CSI 2017-2018

- 83% Four year graduation rate over time (2017-2018)
- 18% AzMERIT math overall Percent Passing over time (2017 2018)
- 15% AzMERIT ELA overall Percent Passing over time (2017-2018)


