

# Mohave Parent Drop-Off & Pick-Up Procedures

- Mohave asks that parents who drive their students to and from school to **drop-off and pick-up in the FRONT PARKING LOT ONLY.**
  - To maintain a smooth flow of traffic, your child may get out of the car anywhere along the sidewalk. You do not have to wait to be at the front of the line for child to exit the vehicle.
    - Students should be ready to quickly get out and get their belongings.
  - Use the lane by the sidewalk for your child to exit/get it. Use the 2<sup>nd</sup> lane to exit the parking lot.
  - For the safety of your child, and the children of others please do not drop off or pick up on any of the surface streets surrounding the school.
  - Valley View Road, directly to the north of the school is reserved for Busses ONLY.
  - Please do NOT use the staff parking lot. Please allow teachers and staff to easily find their space so they can get into the building and prepare to accept students into their rooms.
- **Please BE PATIENT, plan extra time** in the morning, and drop off early (gates open at 7 AM).
- **Please BE THE EXAMPLE for your child.** The surface streets surrounding the school are a tempting place to drop off and pick up. There will be less traffic – Please do not be “the parent” who takes advantage of others who are following procedures. Please act with civility toward other drivers and all students.
- **Please drive with caution.** Many Mohave students walk, ride bikes and skateboards, and use the Trolley system. Students do not always pay attention and may be distracted by peers or cell phones.
  - **Follow all traffic laws and sign postings.** This includes speed limits, stop signs, parking notifications, etc.
  - **Please note the School Zones on Granit Reef Road.** 15 miles per hour is enforced from the first sign to after the crosswalk. “No Passing” is absolute and can be enforced when cars pass a vehicle making a turn.

Want to help keep our children safe? Mohave has funds to pay for crossing guards. Ask Dr. Asmussen for more details.
