- •Being a Title I school also means parental involvement and parents' rights.

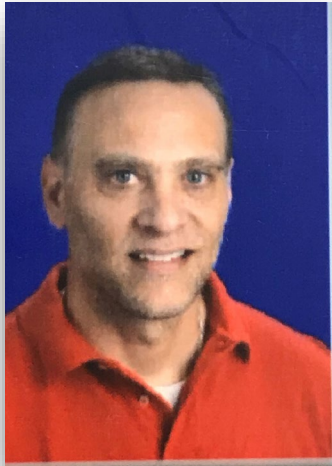


Annual Title I Meeting
