The Scottsdale Unified School District has 31 schools serving approximately 26,000 students. The district celebrated its 100th anniversary in 1996. The boundaries of the SUSD include most of the city of Scottsdale and portions of Phoenix and Paradise Valley. Scottsdale is a community of 249,000 residents.

Our School

Chaparral High School is an AdvancEd accredited, public, comprehensive four year high school, which emphasizes a traditional college preparatory curriculum. Our school challenges students in an interactive environment that values individual differences. We also provide opportunities for all students to realize their potential and develop into responsible citizens who are lifelong learners. Chaparral High School has received an “A” ranking from the Arizona State Department of Education since the inception of this ranking system, and an A+ distinction from the Arizona Educational Foundation. Graduation Requirements

Scottsdale Unified School District requires the successful completion of 22 credits for graduation. This consists of four credits of English and mathematics, three credits of social studies and science, one credit of physical education, and one credit of fine arts or vocational studies. Additionally, the student curriculum requires six elective credits of the student's choice.

Grade Point Average & Class Rank

All classes with the designation "H" or "AP" are honors or Advanced Placement courses and carry a weighted grade value (i.e., A=5.0). The overall GPA includes all courses for which alpha grades are received. Rank in class, based on the student's academic weighted GPA, is computed and posted on the permanent record at the end of the sixth (6th) semester. If a course is repeated, only the highest grade is used in computing the GPA.
