

**ARIZONA IN-STATE UNIVERSITY COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS:** Core competency Requirements: 4 years English, 4 years Math (Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II and one course requiring Algebra II prerequisite), Laboratory Science (3 years), Social Science – 2 years including 1 year American History, 2 years same Foreign Language and 1 year Fine Arts. Students must earn a minimum of a 2.0 GPA in each competency area.

**Application** Apply online at <https://www.asu.edu/apply> or <https://www.commonapp.org/>

**Deadlines** Rolling admissions. On-line applications available **July 1st**. Priority deadline for admissions is **November 1**. Enrollment deposits are due by **May 1st**.

**Testing:** ASU does not superscore. New test scores will be used for scholarship consideration at the discretion of the university. Deadlines for test scores vary; contact your Admissions Representative for more information. ASU automatically reports best score submitted so submit all.

**Admission: Unweighted** 3.0 GPA in core classes listed above; (2.5-2.9) considered, **OR** top 25% **OR** ACT 22 **OR** SAT 1120 (math and verbal combined; does not require writing section). Admissible with up to two (2) deficiencies. Deficiencies cannot be in the same area or be a math/science combination. The IRA A. Fulton School of Engineering, W.P. Carey School of Business (BS degrees only), College of Nursing- BS Nursing, Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts, School of Sustainability, and Walter Cronkite School of Journalism & Mass Communication have additional admission requirements (higher).

**Honors: Barrett, the Honors College** requires a separate application. Go to [www.barretthonors.asu.edu](http://www.barretthonors.asu.edu) to apply. Students interested in Barrett, The Honors College, **first apply to Arizona State University\*** and then may begin the separate Barrett application. Please note: the university application must only be submitted; admission to ASU need not be conferred before a student starts the Barrett application. There are four Barrett application deadlines: **Early Action** (November 1), *Students VERY BEST CHANCE to be admitted is to meet this deadline!* This also allows students to apply for Barrett scholarships with a deadline of February 1, 2020.

**Regular Decision** (January 15), **Late Consideration** (March 8), and **Late Consideration II** (April 1)

\*Prospective Barrett students should have a complete admissions application on file with ASU at least 4-6 weeks before the appropriate Barrett deadline. This includes submitting the ASU application, official test scores, high school transcripts. Students who wait to apply to ASU until a few weeks before a Barrett admissions deadline will struggle to have a complete honors college application submitted on time because the ASU regular application can take 6 weeks to process.

Note: Students must maintain a GPA of 3.25 to stay in the Honors College. Students are required to live in the Barrett Honors residence halls their first two years. A typical freshman room is \$8,340 per year. The BHC Silver meal plan for the full year is \$5,660. The Platinum meal plan is \$6,360 and the Unlimited plan is \$6,670. There is an *additional \$1,000 per semester fee assessed to Barrett students*.

**Housing:** After paying the enrollment deposit, student must log into their My ASU page and complete the MyHousing portal, regardless of whether the student plans to live on or off-campus. To apply for an exemption, the student must select exemption from housing on the last page of the form. Housing assignments are first come, first served, so students are encouraged to apply early. Typically, the MyHousing portal opens in January prior to the start of the student's anticipated fall enrollment term but this can vary.

**Scholarships:** Merit scholarships range from \$2,000 to \$10,000 and are awarded automatically based upon **unweighted core GPA, and SAT/ACT test** scores. **To determine estimated amount of merit-based scholarship go to <https://scholarships.asu.edu/estimator>**. Please be sure to use the Core GPA for scholarship estimation. Scholarships are good for 8 consecutive semesters, with a maintained college GPA of 3.00 and maintain 30 credits per year to renew scholarship. Additional scholarships are available through the scholarship portal as well as through different departments: <https://students.asu.edu/scholarships>. Each scholarship has a separate application process. Your FAFSA should be on file to qualify for many of these additional scholarships. *Be aware that many of the scholarships close in February and March.* Scholarship office: (480) 965-3040.

**Financial Aid:** The FAFSA is available online at <https://fafsa.ed.gov/> on **October 1**. Students are encouraged by ASU to **submit their FAFSA by January 1st**, but should do it as early as possible in October to establish your place in line. Student will be asked for further documentation after FAFSA is received, so check your My ASU regularly for notification. Go to <https://students.asu.edu/financialaid/apply/freshmen> for complete steps.

The **Barack Obama Scholars** Program is based upon need and families with total income and assets of \$42,400 or less and have no course competency deficiencies are eligible for this award. A complete ASU admissions application must be on file and FAFSA must be turned into ASU by **January 15th** to be considered. Obama Scholars program will cover tuition and fees, housing, dining, books, and supplies through grants, scholarships, and work-study. For more information, go to <https://students.asu.edu/obama>.

For students that have competency deficiencies but are admissible to ASU, the **College Attainment Grant** is available. It is also based upon need and students who are Pell grant eligible qualify. A complete ASU admissions application must be on file and FAFSA must be turned into ASU **by July 1st to be considered**. The College Attainment Grant covers the cost of tuition and fees (for fall or spring semesters only) for students through grants, scholarships, and work-study.

**Visit:** If interested in visiting the campus, students should go to <https://visit.asu.edu/>. Most visits include an informational session, a tour of the campus, and an academic session in the major of their choice. Visits are offered weekdays and some Saturdays. On select days in the fall and spring semester, ASU Visits and Events hosts Sun Devil Days, which are a **free**, expanded version of a general visit and include facility tours, a free meal at an on-campus dining hall, and expanded sessions pertinent to prospective ASU students and families. All interested students and family members are encouraged to attend Sun Devil Day to further explore ASU as an educational option.

### **Leadership and Tuition Programs for Incoming Freshmen:**

**Leadership Scholarship Program** is a four year leadership program that provides students with an institutional scholarship which is renewable each year. The **scholarship amount is \$10,000 per academic year**. Students are given many opportunities to discover more about themselves, the leadership skills they possess and explore the opportunities and responsibilities of leadership. During their freshmen year, students are enrolled in two leadership courses and assigned a mentor. During their sophomore, junior, and senior year students are afforded the opportunity to continue to develop as leaders by taking part in service projects, joining student organizations, and starting their own initiatives. In addition, the program allows incoming freshmen to be connected to faculty, staff, and upper classman students as soon as they begin their journey at ASU. One nomination (counselor) per school.

**ASU Next Generation Service Corp** is a four year leadership for ASU bound students interested in social issues. The NGSC is a four-year leadership development program (with a two-year transfer track) where students study their chosen major, engage in practical elements of leadership, learn cross-sector collaboration and take internships each summer working on real issues in the public, private and nonprofit sectors all while pursuing their own chosen social mission. Students train directly with ROTC cadets and midshipmen in leadership exercises and field training exercises. **Includes a Public Service Academy Commitment Award; Base tuition coverage + up to \$2500 in additional gift aid and is renewable for eight semester.** Internships, mentoring and leadership & service experience and 5 classes over 4 years (includes capstone) for certification. Students interested and meet their criteria apply directly on the ASU Scholarship portal.

**ASU Alumni Medallion Program** - a comprehensive program that recognizes and develops a proud tradition of leadership, scholarship, and service. Alumni committee selects 35 Medallion Scholars for each year's entering freshman class. Local alumni also serve as mentors. Students who qualify for the Dean's Scholarship Award (\$5,000 merit – use ASU scholarship estimator to see gpa) who are selected earn their \$3600 renewable scholarship. Must apply online (as of 10/24 not open but students can book mark).

**Entrepreneurship + Innovation Fellow** - students passionate about approaching problems in new ways, developing big ideas and wanting to make their mark at ASU. Personalized support and mentorship and networking with faculty & alums to help students build their innovation portfolio. Students who are selected have the opportunity to start, grow or create a venture of their own. No scholarship mentioned but participants get the opportunity to have ASU investment in projects selected. Apply online.

**Spirit of Service Scholars –** for any degree program - 1 year, \$5,000 scholarship, mentorship from high-profile practitioners and leaders, students experience mentoring high school students, given education on core topics for public service through seven Saturday seminars. seeks to help create the next generation of public service leaders who will transform the nonprofit and government sectors at all levels. Apply directly thru ASU scholarship portal/ASURITE.

**Barrett:** TW Lewis foundation just contributed \$2.5 million to help build the Center for Personal Development (opens August 2020) for these kids, includes a full time director, 4 full time dedicated faculty, coordinator and speaker series as well as a Barrett Student Success Center with career counseling, alumni network, national scholarship advisement & other opportunities.
