Incident Command Team Update

On Monday, June 1, 2020, the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) released a [Roadmap for Reopening Schools](#). The document has served as a guide for schools and districts across the state by detailing strategies in preparation to reopen schools for the 2020-2021 school year.

As previously shared, SUSD has established subcommittees that have reviewed data from the recent Hanover Impact Survey along with Federal and States guidelines. Contingent on further guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the State, the start to the SUSD school year *may include* these options for families that recognize the need for flexible options to suit the diverse needs expressed by SUSD families:

- **An on-campus learning option** as close to “normal” as possible with increased safety protocols.
- **A “hybrid” option** that includes on campus learning paired with remote learning to reduce the number of students present on campus each day.
- **An all online learning option** with classes taught by SUSD teachers [through Scottsdale Online Learning](#).
 - SUSD’s Online Learning is currently available for any student in Arizona for grades 6-12.
 - SUSD is working on expanding its all online learning options to grades K-5. Registration information coming soon for families that select this option.

Input Needed for Reopening Model

SUSD would like your input to ensure we build a learning model that meets the needs of your family. A survey will be sent on Monday, June 15 to parents, students, teachers, staff and administrators.

Please know that we want nothing more than to welcome our students back on August 10, 2020 to a supportive learning environment that focuses on social, emotional and academic support. While the Teaching & Learning and Social Emotional Subcommittees are working hard on such supports, our Operations and Logistics Subcommittee is busy ensuring our campuses are clean, our staff are trained and comfortable with enhanced sanitation procedures.

With the first day of school about two months away, we know that much can still change in our communities to either increase or slow the spread of the coronavirus. Given the unknowns caused by this continuously evolving situation, we are not yet ready to make a commitment to how the first day of school will look or feel for our students and staff.

What we can commit to is the following:

- Learning options will be provided for families, including a 100% online K-12 for families that select this model.
- Beginning July 6, 2020 our District Office will reopen their front offices to the public, by appointment, with appropriate physical distancing and sanitization standards in place. We will announce next week opening schedules for our school sites.
- **We are adding a special Governing Board meeting on July 7, 2020, to discuss reopening on the first day of school, which is August 10, 2020. District Leadership will present more information to the Governing Board, considering then-current government recommendations related to the COVID-19 pandemic. - On July 9, 2020, we will provide the preliminary details on how we plan to start the next school year. In the interim, we will continue to monitor Federal and State guidance and will provide periodic updates.
- August 10, 2020 is scheduled to be the first day of classes for students. Details are forthcoming regarding the models that will be implemented in order to address the needs of SUSD students and families. If plans change, based on new information, you will be informed in a future communication.
- Beginning June 15, 2020, summer camps will open with safety protocols in place. Summer camps will allow us to better understand protocols for returning.

Social Emotional Reopening Plan Subcommittee

The Social Emotional subcommittee is planning a variety of strategies to support re-engagement activities and community building. Additionally, the team will be providing schools with professional development lessons to support trauma informed practices with a focus on increasing protective factors to meet the social emotional needs of students.

Logistics and Operations Reopening Plan Subcommittee

The safety of students and staff remains our number one priority. In addition to procuring Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), the logistics and operations team is working on extra hand washing stations, clearing supplies, electrostatic disinfectant sprayers, as well as working on establishing protocols for our Health Offices.

Safety of staff and students remains our number one priority. If at any time we see an increase in the spread of coronavirus through our community, or we do not feel that safety standards are being maintained, we are prepared to suspend services or modify our plans for reopening. We appreciate our parents and community for providing us with feedback via the Hanover Impact Survey and to those serving on the sub-committees.

Athletics

High school, grades 9-12, athletic camps have the option to begin on June 15, 2020. SUSD is implementing aggressive protective measures to ensure that all participants and staff will have a safe environment.

Those steps include:

- Electrostatic spraying of weight rooms nightly
- Sanitization of balls and equipment regularly

- Increased sanitization of common areas
- Face coverings
- Training for coaches and athletes
- Strict social distancing requirements.
- Athletes will have their temperatures taken and also be asked if they are having any COVID-19 symptoms before each day of camp.

For those who wish to participate this waiver ([English waiver](#), [Spanish waiver](#)) must be signed and brought directly to the coach on the first day of the camp.

Please have athletes bring lots of water if they are attending, dressed appropriately as the locker rooms will be closed, wear a mask indoors while not in aerobic activity, and there will be no spectators allowed.

Please be aware that camp times may be altered slightly due to participation levels, facility size, and social distancing requirements. Any potential time changes will be communicated by the camp coach. Some sites will be having previously scheduled HVAC work done that could impact some camps and we are looking at alternate sites to accommodate any HVAC issues. Participation in these camps is not required and will not negatively impact a player's ability to make a team during the school year.

We respectfully request parents and athletes share in the responsibility of keeping our stakeholders safe by keeping students home when they are sick. Staying home when sick will be imperative this summer and as we phase back into a potential reopening August 10.

2020-2021 Athletic Physicals Grades 6-12

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, SUSD is able to allow 2019-2020 athletic physicals to be utilized for this upcoming school year. The 2019-2020 physicals uploaded into '[Register My Athlete](#)' are available to access if you did not keep a copy of the original. If you would like to use last year's physical please take pages 3-4 from last year, the two pages signed by the doctor, and replace pages 3-4 in this year's packet.

The [2020-2021 packet](#) is available in [Register My Athlete](#). You will still need to complete the remainder of the [2020-2021 packet](#) and upload all documents into Register My Athlete.

Athletes that had any of the following since their last physical MUST obtain a new physical from a doctor and may not use last years: had COVID-19; received a new medical diagnosis, or had a concussion.
